
In November 2013, Typhoon Haiyan (known locally as 'Yolanda') struck the central Philippines and claimed 6,300 lives. The sheer scale of the unprecendented Category 5 super-typhoon impacted more than 16 million people, destroyed 1.1 million houses and crippled all vital services including power, water supply and health services.

tailored to the needs of the community ranging from sheets and nails for shelter construction to food and school packs for families. Additionally, 9 medical professionals traveled as a "mobile clinic" to affected communities serving 1,800 beneficiaries. 79,490 Nov 2013 to Jan 2014
